One student's story

Leili Kattai (54) is a nice and caring lady from Võru. Thanks to her humor and at times strange questions, she creates a joyful atmosphere into our classroom. While you are listening to her stories, you may think that she is a character from some adventure story. The following is how she found her way to Salvation Army and to Bible School.

When I was 49-years old in 2011, I participated at 10-days Estonian Defence League forest trip. My sister called and told me that at our neighbor's place someone had committed murder. As I arrived back home I didn't get any sleep because of overstress and what had happened to our neighbors. I thought then that I would turn on the Elmar radio station, as usual. When things are hard, I usually listen to music to feel better. As I turned on the radio, it rustled horribly. Then I found some unknown radio station and I went to bed.

I heard this beautiful music from radio, but I didn't know I was listening to Family radio (Estonian Christian radio station). I really liked one Finnish song "My Jesus, my savior", that became my favorite song. There was prayer request broadcasting on the radio. I thought, what an interesting broadcast. Now I couldn't change the radio station also, because I wanted to hear my favorite song again.

So as the time passed, I always turned on the radio to listen for that particular song, and from time to time it streamed. Half a year went by and finally I heard about Salvation Army, Inge Ojala and also about a support person training, which attracted my interest. With my friend, I went to find Salvation Army. As we entered there was that sweet smell of soup. My friend went home, but I stayed. I ate the soup and heard that they were going to meet again at 6 p.m. I showed up there too. This was how I started to attend. This has been exciting.

Coming to Bible school has been some kind of miracle for me. I think there's reason for it. Summer before Bible school I had so much work. During that time, I was working at 5 different workplaces. I imagined that the next work I go, is resting from previous one. From one place to another I bicycled. I prayed every morning that bicycle wouldn't break, otherwise I could not make it.

One night, after a busy day, I opened my computer and found the Bible school. I completed the application, at the same time thinking, let's see what is going to happen. After sending it I forgot about it. Two weeks before September, Ago called and told that I am the student of Bible school.

But for me to come to Bible school those jobs ended. This was miracle. My school started on the 5th of September in Tallinn and my last shift ended the evening before in Võru. Life is a roller coaster, you just don't know what's going to happen.
